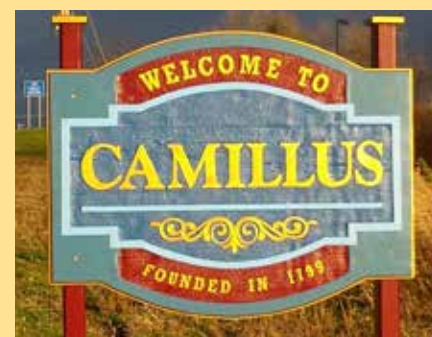

This brochure, which is produced by the Town of Camillus, lists many of the offerings available to all the residents of both the town and village. There are some services that the village offers that differ from the town as follows.

TextMyGov – Receive VILLAGE-wide alerts and holiday delays for trash pick-up by texting **CVALERTS** to **91896**, reply **YES** to opt in. Please note Village trash delays differ from the Town of Camillus Dependable trash delays. For more information, visit our website at villageofcamillusny.com.

Highway Department – The Village DPW operates separately from the town in that we own our own garbage truck and pick up garbage on Monday and Tuesday and recyclables on Wednesday. Tuesday and Friday, we will pick up other items such as yard waste, household materials, small amounts of construction material, and other items you may deem as junk. There is no additional charge for this service. There is a \$25 mattress removal fee which must be paid in advance with cash or check. You can call the office @ 315-672-3484 and make arrangements to pay the fee prior to pick up. If you have excessive amounts of trash/junk you can call the Village Hall for fee details and pre-arrange to rent one of our trucks to be left at your residence overnight for you to load. We do not allow any trash/junk from other areas to be brought in to be picked up by our crew.

Code Enforcement – The Village Code Enforcement is overseen by Bill Reagan. Our Fire Code Enforcement is overseen by John Raflowski. If you need to contact Mr. Reagan, please call the village office at 315-672-3484. Permit applications and Village Laws can be found on our website at villageofcamillusny.com.

Village Hall – The Village Hall hours are Monday through Friday 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM. You can reach Carrie Grooms, Clerk/Treasurer and Sharon Norcross, Deputy Clerk at 315-672-3484. The Village Hall is located at 37 Main Street (across from Camillus Mills). Holiday closings are the same as listed for the town.

The Village meetings are open to the public and occur on the 1st and 3rd Mondays of the month with some exceptions. The meetings start @ 5:00 PM. The dates for 2025 are as follows:

Services:

Road Maintenance- Maintenance of the roadway system includes periodic paving and repair of the roadway system, snow and ice removal, sweeping and removal of street litter, implementation and maintenance of roadway signage, maintenance of roadside sidewalks.

Drainage System Maintenance- Closed drainage system, roadside gutter system, stormwater detention/retention, open swales and drainage ways, green infrastructure.

Brush and Leaf Pickup- The Highway Department picks up residential brush and leaves and operates a composting facility at the Highway Department. Leaves and brush are picked up on a rotating schedule during the months of April through October. (November through March as weather permits) You may drop off yard waste at the Highway Department and compost may be picked up free of charge during business hours.

Metal Disposal- Recyclable metals may be dropped off at the Highway Department or larger items may be picked up by the department (by appointment only).

The Assessor's office is responsible for setting and maintaining assessments, retaining and updating inventory records, processing and storing deeds on all transfers and administering exemptions on all parcels in the town

SCHOOL TAX RELIEF (STAR)

New Property Owners – New Applicants

New STAR applicants will receive a credit in the form of a check directly from New York State. Apply for the STAR CREDIT directly with the State of New York either online at <https://www.tax.ny.gov/pit/property/star/> or call 518-457-2036 to register.

Existing STAR Exemption Recipients

Beginning in 2026, seniors no longer need to apply to their assessor to qualify for Enhanced STAR exemption. In addition, only one resident owner of the property— regardless of the relationship of the owners—must be at least 65 years of age as of December 31 of the benefit year. New York State will notify property owners if they qualify.

EXEMPTIONS The Office continues to administer the Senior Citizen Low Income exemption (RP-467). This exemption is not the same as the STAR exemption. Renewals are sent yearly, and applications **MUST** be returned/received to our office no later than March 1.

There are various exemptions offered to property owners. Applications are available either at the Assessor's office or online. For instructions or questions, please call the office or to download forms please visit the New York State Department of Taxation and Finance website. The following is a list of common exemptions administered by this office:

- Agricultural (RP-305)
- Business (RP-485)
- Disability and Limited Income (RP-459)
- Senior Citizens Low Income (RP-467)
- Veteran (RP-458)

ALL Applications can be returned via mail, drop box or in-person from 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. daily and must be returned to the office prior to March 1st (taxable status date).

QUESTIONS ABOUT YOUR VALUE

Your property assessment or value is based on the prior year's sales and your property's unique information or data. The Assessor's office is responsible for maintaining, updating and recording any changes. Data is available online at the Onondaga County's website. This site also offers comparable sales, grievance information and forms, as well as tax maps. All this information is reviewed yearly by the New York State Office of Real Property.

INFORMAL REVIEW/COMPLAINTS

Informal appointments to discuss your property's value are available after May 1st. Submit a letter detailing concerns, including name, address and phone number. If necessary, include photos. For recent sales, please include MLS, purchase contract and appraisal report. The grievance process is always available if you still have concerns about your assessment. Grievance Day is the fourth Tuesday in May.

GRIEVANCE

Grievance Day for 2026 will be Tuesday, May 26th. Forms (RP-524) may be downloaded from Onondaga County at <http://www.on.gov.net/rpts/AssessmentInformation.html> or from New York State at https://www.tax.ny.gov/forms/orpts_cur_forms.htm.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

Our office is responsible for enforcement of the NY State Uniform Building and Fire Prevention Code, the NY State Energy Code, and the Municipal Code of the Town of Camillus - including Zoning, Property Maintenance, Flood Zone and Stormwater regulations. Garages, sheds, swimming pools, hot-tubs/spas, fences, decks, basement remodels – including removal and/or replacement of existing, all require building permits.

Electrical work – except the replacement of fixtures – requires an electrical inspection. Please, see the Code Enforcement Page for the list of APPROVED Electrical Inspectors.

ALL Plumbing work requires a permit from Onondaga County Plumbing Control – 315-435-6614

One- and two-family homes used as rental property must be registered with and inspected by this office.

Complaints regarding Zoning, NYS Uniform and Energy Codes, Rental Property, High Grass and Weeds, Accumulation of Rubbish, Nuisance Vehicles, Building Without a Permit, and Illegal Burning may be made to this office.

Special events on non-residential parcels outside of the normal daily operation or approved site plan require approval from the Planning Board. Application must be made at least 60 days prior to the proposed event. This includes parking lot sales, block parties, food trucks, fund raisers, carnivals, petting zoos, etc.

All applications for residential and commercial building begin with this office, including referrals to the Planning Board and Zoning Board of Appeals.

AS OF JANUARY, 2023 BOTH PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION DISPOSAL BOXES ARE NO LONGER AVAILABLE FOR DISPOSAL OF PRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS AT THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING. CITIZENS CAN CHECK WITH LOCAL PHARMACIES FOR MEDICATION DISPOSAL BOX LOCATIONS.

The Camillus Police Department provides several services to include:

Civilian Fingerprinting Services-

If you need fingerprints for any reason and they must be ink-rolled, you can schedule an appointment

Property Checks-

The Camillus Police will make periodic checks of your residence for the security of your home while you are on vacation, or your home is unoccupied.

Home Security Evaluation-

A specially trained Camillus Police Officer will come to your home and complete an extensive security and safety check of your home.

Child ID's-

The Camillus Police provide FREE child ID cards for Camillus children that includes a digital fingerprint, a digital photograph, and the child's identifying information.

Car Seat Check/Installation-

The Camillus Police has trained Child Passenger Safety technicians that can provide FREE car seat checks/installation for expecting parents, parents and/or guardians.

I would like to take this opportunity to ask dog owners to be mindful of your dog's behavior and how that behavior may affect other community neighbors such as: keeping the barking from your dog controlled so it does not disturb others. While walking your dog, refrain from allowing your dog to stray onto private property, urinate on mailboxes, flowers, or shrubs as it can be damaging. If your dog needs to defecate, please be prepared with a bag to pick the waste up and take it with you for a proper disposal. Don't approach dogs unless you know the dog very well and don't let strangers approach your dog, even good dogs bite when uncomfortable or startled. Thank you!

REMINDER: The Town of Camillus has two dog friendly parks, Camillus Park and the Erie Canal Trail Park. All other Town parks do not allow dogs in them. As required by law, dogs must be leashed at all times, and their feces must be picked up and disposed of properly by the person walking that dog. This ensures safety for you and your dog and allows others to enjoy these parks.

DOG LICENSING: Required by New York State and Town law, all dogs over four months of age must be licensed. Licenses are issued by the Town Clerk's office and proof of a current rabies vaccination and proof of spay/neuter, (if it has been done) must be supplied. In Camillus, the fee is \$7 if spayed/neutered; \$14 if not.

MISSING OR FOUND DOGS: If your dog is missing, or if you have found a dog, contact the Dog Control Office immediately to report it. The goal of the Dog Control Office is to get the stray dogs we pick up back to their owner safely and promptly.

Sewer Problems? Contact WEP 24/7 at (315) 435-3157

Basement backups are unpleasant, stressful and pose potential health risks and property damage. Onondaga County Department of Water Environment Protection (WEP) investigates reports of wastewater backups free of charge for connected properties within the County Consolidated Sewer District (CSD). To see a map of areas within the CSD, visit Onondaga.gov/wep/service-area.

Save the Drain

Fortunately, there are steps you can take to minimize the risk and protect your home. Pouring fats, oils, and grease down the drain or flushing products not meant to go into the wastewater system (see Onondaga.gov/wep/unflushables) are common causes for clogs and backups. To properly dispose of hot fats, oils, and grease, pour into a heat-resistant container, allow to cool, and dispose in the trash. Similarly wipe away oils and fats from dishes, use strainers to catch food scraps and dispose in the trash. Dispose all "unflushables" in trash (hint - only toilet paper properly breaks down) and use soaps and detergents as directed. When in doubt, throw it out!

Check your Connections

Groundwater and rainwater from sump pumps, roof and basement drains connected to the sewer system increase flow, strain capacity, and can result in backups. Redirect rainwater from your roof downspouts to discharge over the land, not to the sewer. Sump pumps, yard and driveway drains also should not be connected to the sanitary sewer, but discharge to your yard. By fixing just one connection, a homeowner can keep thousands of gallons unnecessary water flow out of the sewer.

Trash and Recycling Service

Our service begins before 6AM, so please place your totes out the night before.

The Do's and Don'ts of Dependable Totes:

- Black lid is for trash, Yellow lid for recycling
- Place totes 3ft away from any objects located in your driveway
- Totes should be placed at least 3ft apart
- Place everything in the tote even if the lid doesn't close completely
- Place totes as close to the edge of your curb as possible with lids opening towards the street and arrows pointing out



Yard Waste

Leaves and brush are picked up on a rotating schedule during the months of April through October by the town. (November through March as weather permits). You may also drop off yard waste at the Highway Department during their business hours.

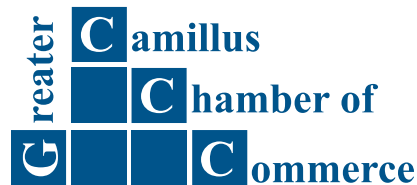
